

As I write this, we have had two Sundays on which we have explored phrases of the Apostles Creed using the video by Adam Hamilton. While the presentation is quite simplistic, I believe the message is worthwhile and engenders deep consideration and study of vital questions. What is of greater import in our Christian walk than examining the evidence for the existence of God, exploring what kind of God is revealed in Scripture, exploring the implications of why our beliefs matter and affirming ways in which we might appropriately respond to a personal Creator God. Wow! Just the first phrase of the Creed could fill a lifetime of contemplation and study!

In the second tape we looked at all the phrases describing our Lord Jesus Christ. We examined evidence of the existence of the historical Jesus. We encountered the mysteries and the implications of Jesus' birth, death, and resurrection. We explored, through a consideration of three titles applied to Jesus, what Christians believe about him and affirm that the story of Jesus is our defining story.

In the next four weeks we'll look at what the Old and New Testaments have to say about the Holy Spirit. We will explore, through a consideration of analogies and graphic representations, the mystery and paradox of the Trinity. We will encounter the working of the Holy Spirit in the church and in individual lives. We, hopefully, will commit to listen more fully for the Spirit's voice and to welcome the Spirit's work.

In week four, we will examine the definition of the holy catholic church and explore what it means to be the body of Christ in the world. We'll strive to have a new understanding of the communion of saints. Week Five will deal with definitions of sin and the burden of guilt. We finish in week six with examining what the Bible says happens after death and the resurrection of the body.

All heavy stuff which we could literally spend years studying, but perhaps this will get us thinking. My special thanks to Helen and to Harry for extending this study and discussions into our 9:30 Forum.

God bless you all as we journey during this time of examining our beliefs.
